




Bonsai Pavilion at Safari Park: 'Lyn Stevenson, Liaison


We have had to put the annual SDBC meeting, picnic, and auction on a hold status. The Park has assured that they will let us know when they too have a go-ahead plan.

OFFICER REPORTS

- Programs (Ignacio De La Torre)
 - Barbara and Ignacio discussed the By-laws and will be sending out a working document for the board to review and then later to be presented at a club meeting. The By-law document mainly only needs to be cleaned up and have the new Zoom board meeting option added.
 - > Currently looking for someone to host the next presentation for the club
- Education (Bill Graham)
 - All classes are still on hold until things open back up
- Special Projects (Markel Farley)
 - > Reservations have been made to tentatively hold the Spring Show on Memorial Day weekend. Show will be dependent on COVID-19 restrictions and the issuance of city and park to permit gathering. Will need to consider guest limitations and possible use of multiple rooms as well as outdoor areas to adhere to local restrictions
 - > Items listed will be completed for show preparation
 - o -Notices will be sent to prior vendors that may be interested in bringing items for the sale
 - General notice to be sent to club members
 - -Sign-ups to be gathered for Tree to show
 - o -Volunteers needed for working show
 - -Specific time slots to be scheduled and maintained for volunteers so that limitations for # of people at show follows suggestedCOVID-19 guidelines
 - The possibility to add club soil/tools/etc. for sale during the Spring show was discussed and will be considered as a possibility to be decided on
- Membership (Uday Pandey)
 - > Memberships continue to come in (17 new memberships/renewals came in since December/315 current members)
- <u>Treasurer</u> (Jaya Kaelberer)
 - A large \$2,500 payment for the club insurance went out in February
- Secretary (Carla Marasco)
 - > Board was all in favor of creating a new Google Docs storage drive to store important documents for the club.
 - > Storage cost is free up to 15GB then \$20 annually for each additional 100GB if needed
 - > Each board member will begin to gather items pertaining to their role to be added to drive
 - > Items stored on drive will be available upon request by all club members (with personal information removed)
 - > Further development of document storage procedures to be developed and led by Carla (next steps/action items to be worked through over next couple of weeks and sent to board for discussion)
