He will also teach how to properly prepare a pot to be used for repotting, setting your screen and tie down wires and lastly how to dye and create top dressing for your trees after repotting. Notes from our September Meeting Presenter: by Keith Carter



San Diego Bonsai Club members were treated to a presentation by one of Southern California's up-and-coming young bonsai stylists at the September meeting. Julian Tsai, a North County resident who worked for two years as an apprentice at one of Japan's top bonsai nurseries, provided his own special insights into best practices for bonsai enthusiasts.

Working on a large prostrata juniper, Julian explained that his <u>first step</u> in designing a tree is to identify the front, which he said is the view that highlights the most appealing elements of the tree. <u>Secondly</u>, he determines the angle at which the tree should rest in the pot. In some cases, that might mean tilting the tree to highlight its best elements. Once those have been identified, Julian then decides how to design the branches for the most effective visual appeal.

For the demonstration juniper, one of Julian's first steps was to create a shari along a large section of the trunk. When creating such an element by stripping bark from the tree, "you want to make sure you see the separation between the live and dead areas," he said.

He wrapped one of the larger branches in raffia to bend it more readily. A key tip from Julian for applying raffia: Be sure to twist the raffia in the same direction as the wire you plan to use, he said. And make sure the raffia is evenly dispersed around the branch.

Julian also related some of his experiences working in Japan, including the fact that most apprentices nowadays are from other countries. Interestingly enough, the SDBC provided one of his first exposures to

bonsai. After attending a club show in 2014, Julian was inspired to begin working on trees. A few years later, while attending college, a friend who had done an apprenticeship in Japan recommended him for a position with a nursery there. Among his honors was winning the Harry Hirao Award from the Golden State Bonsai Federation in 2018.

Julian, who conducts workshops and offers one-on-one instruction, said he enjoys bonsai because of its diversity, with many different trees and many different styles, including his own favorites: oaks and native species. His website is bonTsai.

At the end of his presentation, the large juniper styled by Julian was auctioned. The winning bid was \$230 from Matt Jillson, with proceeds going to the club.

Safari Park Bonsai Pavilion gets \$15,000 county grant, by Keith Carter

SDBC will be able to complete its long-awaited creation of a hardscaped plaza area in the Bonsai Pavilion at the San Diego Zoo Safari Park, thanks to a \$15,000 grant awarded through the San Diego County Board of Supervisors.

On Sept. 3, Cipriano Vargas, from District 3 Supervisor Terra Lawson-Remer's office, was given a tour of the Bonsai Pavilion by club volunteers Jim Kirchmer (who spearheaded the grant application), Mark Edgar, curator John Jackson and club president Sue Carter. Several Safari Park staff members also took part in the tour.

The grant will allow the club to expand the width of the existing walkway and add an additional seven bonsai display poles in what is now just bare dirt at the upper part of the pavilion. Jim, Mark, and John also provided Cipriano with a rundown of all the work that has been done at the pavilion since the start of the pandemic. Those

improvements included installation of concrete pedestals for each of the trees on display, replacing the aging, deteriorating wooden

benches, with all the work being completed by club volunteers. Paired with a \$1,500 grant from Qualcomm, the county grant assures that the team will not have to dip into club or pavilion funds for the project. Work on the upgraded plaza area is expected to be under way before the end of the year, with completion expected by early 2022. It will create an ideal spot to host special events such as our annual May picnic.

We had sales of about \$11k, the club's part being about \$3K and the members' part about \$8k - greater than the income from Fall Show 2019. We also had a larger attendance than in 2019.


