

## SDBC Education

## September Program

There is no beginning class in October (we'll see you at the Club's picnic in Poway). The last Beginning Class will be in **November** when the trees will be finished with styling and then repotted in a bonsai pot.

In November, we will have the sign-up sheets available for the next Beginning Class starting in January; cost for the class is \$40.

#### Upcoming Skills Class

In November, Michael Sykes will teach a class on wiring. Learn how and when to use raffia; how to protect the tree with tubing; how to make the wiring both attractive and effective. This is a great opportunity to bring a tree you are unsure about how to wire and get some direction from a bonsai master.

Wire will be provided.

Shirley Kavanaugh gave us a big lesson on small bonsai. Mame bonsai, those tiny bonsai that are less than six inches, are tough to keep alive. But Shirley has some trees that have been in training since 2001. One of her secrets to success is repotting yearly. She demonstrated her technique with the potting of a Kingsville boxwood tree. Shirley placed the mesh normally placed within the pot on the bottom of the pot and then wires up through the mesh. She cautioned that trees such as boxwoods do not like to have their roots tweaked, so remove all soil gently. Put them in water to get all soil off. A second secret—SHARP scissors for root pruning. These little guys depend on very few roots so the roots have to be treated well.

Unlike larger bonsai, mame grow fine in commercial bonsai potting soil that holds moisture. Make a cone of soil in the center of the pot then place the tree in the pot and –secret three—rotate the tree around to fit the roots into the pot, trimming the roots as necessary. Wire the tree into the pot and add soil as needed. Water and put moss on half of pot to hold in soil. Style the tree by removing foliage that is pointing down, dead or large leaves, and any foliage that is causing excessive shading.

That is half the battle. The second half is her secrets to watering. Shirley brought in her plastic shoebox half-filled with hydroponic balls. The mame sit on top of the balls, high enough for the foliage to get air circulation, but providing moisture. Shirley waters three times a day and uses Superthrive. Her closing remark to the club: "Mame are no trouble at all, except to keep them alive."

Don't forget that SDBC has an extensive library of Bonsai material and helpful librarian Steve Clemons there to assist you.

#### 6. Appointed Position Reports:

'lyn Stevenson, Safari Park Pavilion Appointed Position, reported: We meet on 1st/3rd Saturday of each month. We will have a planning meeting; the board needs plans to how we will be spending money. Safari Park wants us to do more programs for 2015; four dates have been given us so there also will be planning for programs.
