Bob will be discussing soil qualities, soil components, soil bulk density/moisture/aeration, bonsai soil ideas, and comments from the experts on soils such as akadama. Much time and effort is expended in cultivating our bonsai; learn how we can help them thrive under our care and training through soil management techniques.



Minutes of the Regular Meeting of the Members December 14, 2014



- **1.** Call to Order: The regular meeting of the membership of the San Diego Bonsai Club was called to order at 10:00 a.m. by Dan Sola, President. It was confirmed that a quorum was present.
- 2. Approval of Minutes: The minutes from the November 9, 2014 meeting were approved as published.
- 3. New Members: Sonya Holmquist, VP for Membership welcomed new members Jenny and Joe Cho, Abi and Ellie Brownlee (daughters of member Tim Brownlee), and Ayse Colak (daughter of member Nazim Colak), and introduced Cesar Velasquez and Sylvia Mosse first time attendees. Sonya reminded members it is time to renew membership. Dan presented a gold pin for Sonya's volunteering in 2014.

4. Board Member Reports:

Bob Hale 1st Vice President (VP), reported: For January meeting, he will be doing a demonstration on soil bringing in new facts into the club and basic soil mixtures. Dan presented Bob a gold pin for Bob's volunteering in 2014. Gary Jones acknowledged Bob Hale for all the work he did for the Monterey Cypress presentation in November.

Allan Edwin Treasurer, reported: Discussed the Pro Forma through November and raising the percentage fee for sales from 15% to 20% because the sales tax is at 8% and now we are accruing the credit card fee. More than half of the sales are with credit cards, and that's another 3% we pay in fees to the bank. The Spring Show raised \$1,500 which could bring more to the Club if we had the percentage higher, and could be used for other programs, outreach, and education. The Board has approved and adopted raising the fee to 20%. The overall Club and Pavilion budget are in the black; total revenue was \$28,000 and expenses \$26,200. Dan presented Allan with a gift and a gold pin for the volunteering in 2014 and for being a departing officer of the club.

Barbara French-Lee, VP of Education, reported: Thank you and she is grateful for all the volunteer and help that people gave her with the classes this year. We have two classes coming up: Fred Miyahara's grafting class in January and Michael Sykes' Foemina Juniper class in February. Dan presented a gold pin to Barbara for volunteering in 2014.

Janice Hale, VP of Special Projects, reported: Winter Silhouettes trip (which includes bonsai exhibit, vendors, entertainment, a raffle, and a dinner) is January 17th. Two nurseries (House of Bonsai and Green Product Sales) will also be on the itinerary. The trip to the Huntington Gardens for the Bonsai-a-thon is on February 28th; it is \$40 and will be by bus. The Spring Show is scheduled for April 25th and 26th, 2015 with set up on the 23rd and 24th. Dan presented a gold pin to Janice for volunteering in 2014.

5. Appointed Position Reports:

John Jackson, Safari Park Pavilion Curator, reported: Thank you to volunteers for 2014. New volunteers are always needed. Dan presented John with a gold pin for his volunteering in 2014.

- **6. Old Business:** The Club is still looking for volunteers for organizing refreshments.
- 7. New Business: Gary Jones has been appointed the Show Chair for 2015.
- **8.** Announcements: President Dan Sola announced Glenn Jensen as new Curator for the Japanese Friendship Garden. Dan presented Brenda Crann, 'lyn Stevenson, Steve Clemons, Dennis Wagner, Eric Jacobson, Dave Barker, Shirley Kavanaugh, Charlie Mosse, Abe Far, Patrick O'Brien (not present), and John Voss gold pins for volunteering in 2014. In addition, Dan had a gift and gold pin for David Choy, but David was not present.
- **9.** Installation of 2015 Officers 'lyn Stevenson installed the following officers for 2015: President, Dan Sola; First Vice President, Bob Hale; Vice President for Education, Barbara French-Lee; Vice President for Special Projects, Janice Hale; Treasurer, Peter Chong; Secretary, Brenda Crann; Vice President Membership, Sonya Holmquist; and Immediate Past President, Abe Far.
- **10. Annual Bonsai Styling Competition:** Bob Hale introduced the four teams for the Bonsai competition. The team of Allan Edwin and Gary Jones won first place.

Bonsaí Ideas by Marty Mann

A NEW YEAR, THE CYCLE BEGINS AGAIN

January is the time to "reset" the cycle". Bonsai people start with an eager outlook for a spring season by getting ready in advance and understanding what can and should be done at this time. You have put most of your trees to bed for a winter rest. Can you now wait for spring to come? In the world of bonsai "it just isn't so," there is no IDLE TIME.

The soil mixes in your potted trees have been somewhat inactive due to the cooler weather of the past few months. Soil bacteria, in it's dormant state, has not been providing any nitrogen to these growing plants while they rested. Now is the time to plan ahead for your supply of fertilizers. You can resume the feeding schedules in late February.

Another good way to prepare for the spring is to focus on pots. Inventory, cleanup, and organizing is a "to do" item, but gets put on the back burner. Clean as you go will help with this goal. Scrub them with a strong soapy solution and some bleach. Apply a lime-off cleaner or vinegar to the white spots (or just some elbow grease and cleanser) and rinse them well. Allow them to dry in the full sun to prevent any infestation carryover.

This is by far the best time to study plant designs. Spend some serious time with each tree by carefully reviewing the branch structures, the trunk lines, their placement and relationships. In the case of deciduous trees, you can see them clearly, in a winter silhouette, without the disguise of a blanket of leaves that hide their faults and problem areas. Remember the basic bonsai design principals of crossing branches, bars, angles, elevations, and relationships to the trunk movement. These important design points distinguish your tree's quality from just any other bonsai.

While studying your tree's design, also look to encourage twiggy-ness and new branch development as soon as spring growth begins. Cut back long tertiary branches on junipers and deciduous trees to shorten internodes.

Finally, another important activity at this time involves your tools. Sort them out. Sharpen all cutting edges, remove accumulations of rust and tar stains by using the new Japanese erasers, dip into a bleach solution to purify, then oil all surfaces for protection.

Next month, we will review the basics of good soil composition and the need to prepare your soil batches ahead of time for the repotting activities.
