Lyn Stevenson's Foemina Forest

Lyn started the the foemina forest in 1981with 5 trees. By 1991 there were 17 trees, the arrangement guided by the master's hands of Shig Miya. Some of the new trees came from Frank Goya, Maggie Carpenter, and Mas Moriguchi.

A pot was bought from Bruce Hisayasu into which the trees were transplanted. They were worked in June 1994 and again in February 1995. John Naka had 'lyn stake the #1 tree to "anchor" the group. 'lyn added 2 trees from Shig Miya...bringing the total number to 19.

Refinements were conducted while studying with John Naka, Warren Hill, Ben Oki and others.

The Foemina Forest was the winner at the Del Mar Fair in 1999. It has been shown at the SDBC Show, Nan Pu Kai show, South Coast Botanic Garden, GSBF Convention Exhibit and the California

Bonsai Society show. Lyn generously gifted the forest to the SDBC Bonsai Pavilion at the Safari Park in 2019.
