#### Reginners Class

Our final Beginners Class of the year will conclude with potting our trees. **Dave Rochester** and his able helpers will show the Beginners how to properly trim the roots and pot their junipers, so that next year the junipers will begin growing nice and early. Beginners, please bring your tree, shear, chopsticks, and your willingness to learn! Winter begins in a month or two for us, with lowering temperatures and hopefully more rain, so the roots will have a little time to grow before they slow down greatly.

#### Intermediate Class

Fertilizers are a tangled, complex topic but we will take a few bites out of it and see what we can learn. Like the soil class, we will be looking at an array of both organic and inorganic fertilizers and will discuss how they stack up to bonsai culture. The important thing is to feed our trees well, whatever product we use, because a healthy tree responds to training much better than a weak tree. You don't have to sign up for this class, just show up.

# San Diego Bonsai By Marty Mann Bonsai Jdeas #107 November, 2010

November is a wonderful time to really see all of your trees. Foliage, during most of the year, obscures the skeleton branch formations of the inner tree. Now is the time to trim excess branches, as well as crossing, misplaced and malformed branches. Study the radial formation of the rootage. Study the taper of the trunk line. Concentrate on building a twiggy branch structure. Wire branches during this dormant period with great care since they are brittle during cooler weather months. Try to see trees with strong background light to properly study their design, shape and position in the pot. Fully exposed deciduous material can be photographed (preferably in black and white), studied, and refined.

Since warm weather sometimes occurs at this time of year, potted trees must be watered regularly, but cautiously, even if brief winter rains do occur. Reduce watering activity during the cool winter months but don't overlook drying winter winds. Don't allow trees to dry out, even during dormancy periods.

Coolness brings slow growth and during this period of dormancy. Trees require only a dampening of the root zone since transpiration of moisture is essentially non-existent. However, be aware of the prevailing and drying winds. The porosity of a good bonsai soil mix allows moisture to quickly escape a shallow pot. If you count on the regularity of an automatic timed watering system, the timing cycle should be adjusted for winter requirements.

Don't feed most trees in a dormant state unless the fertilizer is very low in nitrogen. Junipers and all conifers may be fed lightly during this period since they do not become completely dormant in warm climates. Feeding encourages winter growth but many growers do feed (0-10-10) material to maintain good winter health. Trees require the necessary phosphorus, potassium and various trace elements and minerals during this period. Woody portions of the trees, i.e., trunks, branches and rootage continue to grow.

Clean up the bonsai areas. Don't allow litter and dropped leaves to accumulate since this creates a haven for insect eggs and fungus spores to thrive. Remove all leaves, seedpods and dried flower heads from all material--whether in pots or growing containers. Particularly, check pine trees. Remove any disfigured or long needles that show brown tips.

Gather, and place into flats, the winter moss that formed in the shaded areas around the yard. Let it grow for use in spring to dress the bonsai. It is advisable to remove any build-up of moss that accumulated as a thatch on potted material. This build-up tends to reject surface watering and prevents moisture from penetrating to the root mass.

Reconsider the arrangement of trees on your benches. Trees, which may have been moved into shaded areas to avoid hot summer sun, can now be exposed to better light. This is an excellent time to sort out trees into first-things-first categories. Attend to those trees that require winter trimming while the branch silhouettes are easy to study. Plan to repot trees that show signs of being root bound. Check the rootage on all trees. Allow some surface exposure of surface roots to encourage a change from soft root tissue to the development of texture similar to the outer trunk bark.






#### Bonsai Pavilion Donor Board
