

## SDBC Education for March

## The more we share, the more we learn

We will start this month off with some great news. The Mas Takanashi Educational Grant has been offered to three <u>outstanding</u> candidates. All three have been with the SDBC for many years. They have shown consistent support and enthusiasm for the club. They all have a very keen, long term interest in Bonsai, and very importantly, enjoy showing and teaching others about Bonsai. Please congratulate Barbara French-Lee (VP of Special Projects), Tim Kirkish and Trisha Bonapace on their acceptance into an excellent learning program. We wish them well and to have fun with the hard but rewarding work ahead.

The Second session of the Winter beginner's class went very well thanks gain to 'Lyn Stevenson and the volunteer assistants Dave Woodall, Mark and Cathy Edgar, John Voss and Jason Tucker and others. Looks like everyone showed up for round 2 with lots of wiring and shaping going on to the abundant new growth. Be sure to bring your trees to the last session of the class in March to learn proper methods of securing the tree to the pot and how to correctly pot up your tree with the proper soil. With the warm weather continuing, the growth should still be strong, so ask for hints on proper pruning and pinching of the trees. Note that the next beginner's class will start in April and will continue in June and July (remember May is the SDBC party at the Bonsai Pavilion at the Safari Park). Plant selection has not been completed but is heading toward the formal or informal upright style. Cost of the class is still only \$35. Such a deal!

The pine workshop in March will be working on Japanese Black Pines from Muranaka Bonsai Nursery under the expert eye of Fred Miyahara and the Piney's (those who have been training with Fred). These Black pines are field grown and freshly dug. They are excellent stock with which to begin learning how to bonsai the black pine. The pines will not be re-potted until next

year. You will be doing some needle removal and some work on the soil under the watchful of the Piney's. There is much to learn about growing a black pine that will be strong and vigorous. The cost of the class is \$70. This will include soil, wire and container (training type). There are two openings as

of now, Feb.23. Please call me at 619-851-7187or email me at smosse@cox.net.

#### Important Note:

Anyone who worked on a Muranaka pine at last year's class should bring their tree to the workshop in March for re-potting, follow up advice or just for sharing if you have already re-potted. You may bring your own soil mix or the club will provide a suitable mix for you. You will need to bring your own transplant pot. Fred highly recommends a 10" Azalea type terracotta clay pot as it is a low profile pot still with adequate soil volume for your pine and it 'breathes' to help keep the roots from staying too wet. Remember that for Black pines excellent drainage is essential, especially in the lower portion of the pot to prevent root rot.

Spring, Renewal Time, Reactivate Everything!

Spring is the time of renewal. It's time to take stock of your trees, whether in pots or still in training stages. Review their future. It's time to resume a regular schedule of fertilization since the nutrients in the soil have been leached during the dormant winter months. Bud swelling, the sign of spring awakening, begins to show and repotting time is upon us.

Last month was the time to ready repotting supplies - a well drained soil mix, clean pots, supplies of insecticides and fungicides, etc. etc. Now is time for a repotting schedule-- before the buds really open up. Finish your activity before the leaves begin to show. This timing applies primarily to deciduous and flowering trees. Evergreens and conifers such as junipers, fir, spruce and pines can follow. If the tree has begun to flower or develop fruit, delay repotting until after blooming. Until the plants become reestablished- water cautiously

It's a good idea to include a small amount of Bone Meal and Ironite in your soil mixture to encourage development of new fine rootage. There is a difference of opinion as to the value of including Cottonseed Meal too early. I believe that this fertilizer is better applied later in March to encourage new green growth. Even if bone meal is a slow starter it adds nutrient benefit to the plant. Don't overdo your fertilizing. It's a common mistake to consider the idea that a little good is better if more is applied. Repotted plants may be fed as soon as signs of new growth are apparent. A suggested standard mix is 75% cottonseed meal / 25% bone meal. Trees may also be given an interim push by using a liquid food like Miracle Gro between regular monthly feedings.

Winter dormancy is over. Bring your trees out of their winter protection from cold winds. Deciduous trees may show the first signs of bud breaking. Keep an eye on any fast growing branches that quickly create elongated internodes. Light pruning of growing tips is in order to control this situation, however do not do any serious trimming until the new growth has hardened. Maintain the shape of the tree as the branches begin to grow. Twiggy branching will be the benefit of regular pinching. Watch for wire scars that may have developed during the past few months.

As each new shoot develops, determine if it is to play a part in your overall design plan. If you need a longer branch - let it grow. If you need more twiggyness or fullness cut the shoots back to two or three sets of leaves. New shoots develop from the cut areas. Don't allow the tree to spend its energy growing unwanted shoots.

Some transplanting and repotting activities may have begun last month but do most of the traumatic replanting work before the growth develops. As warmer weather arrives the root systems will begin to push new hair roots. Repotting at this time prevents excessive damage to the existing root ball.

Newly potted trees should be shaded from direct sun until new growth begins. By moving your trees into sunny areas you stimulate the growth of foliage. Newly potted trees should be allowed to develop new fine rootage that support new foliage. When new growth is evident it's time to begin light fertilization. Full sun encourages smaller leaves and shorter internodes.


