Nico Goossens is co-owner of Lico Orchids and Flowers in Encinitas, CA. He grows a variety of orchid genera, especially species and is very interested in conservation of Southern California orchids. In his research on quality care for orchids he has become expert at enhancing water quality for plants. He will speak with us about the chemical makeup of Southern California water and how that affects plant growth. He will present solutions about how we can improve the quality of our water in growing bonsai through various techniques and devices we can use to enhance the quality of water coming into our homes.

peaceful, relaxing place to enjoy.



Library Update

A Bonsai Magazine Bonanza

Recent issues of the following bonsai magazines are now in the library. A few highlights are given for each issue:

- Bonsai Focus March/April and May/June 2018. Previews (in both issues, covering different topics) of Andrea Meriggioli's upcoming book, Bonsai Maples – everything you need to know about growing and nursing Acer palmatum and Acer buergeriarum. Other highlights include a repotting guide for 20 deciduous species; creating a rocklike landscape planning using found wood; techniques for rock plantings; and how to create a finished gardenia bonsai starting from scratch. All in addition to many photos of award winning bonsai and techniques of the masters.
- Golden Statements Spring 2018. Beautifully photographed trees from the Baikoen Bonsai Kenkyuka 54th annual Winter Silhouettes show and the Bay Area Bonsai Associates 37th annual bonsai exhibition. Also check out the restyling of a legacy sierra juniper (approximately 400 years old) by Mike Pistello and Daisaku Namato.
- BCI Bonsai & Stone Appreciation Jan/Feb/March 2018. Photos from Stephen Voss's wonderful and evocative book, In Training, featuring bonsai from the National Bonsai and Penjing Museum in Washington, D.C. Also, step by step instructions for creating a root wood stand. Preview of the 2018 BCI International Convention in Mulhouse, France, and the seven-day post-convention tour of the Alsace region of France.

New books in the library:

- Miniature Living Bonsai Landscapes: the Art of Saikei, Herb L. Gustafson, 1994. The book covers the concept of depth and the five elements of landscape: harmony, consistency, balance, scale and interest. Hundreds of photos guide you through the creative process of saikei development.
- Pop Bonsai: Fun with Arranging Small Trees and Plants, *Lisa Tajima*, 2004. Be prepared to have your concept of bonsai "popped." Lisa's freestyle version, in fun containers – many handmade by her – brings whimsy and joy to the viewer.
