With our unusually hot and humid days, our trees are under some stress. Some of them may need to move into partial shade until the intense heat passes and as always watch the watering. Water during the day to keep tree foliage from staying wet overnight. Plant diseases caused by fungi can increase with the humidity so watch closely, use a fungicide when you first notice a problem, prune for good airflow and place your tree where air is circulating.

July Program Review: Ted Matson

Upcoming Programs

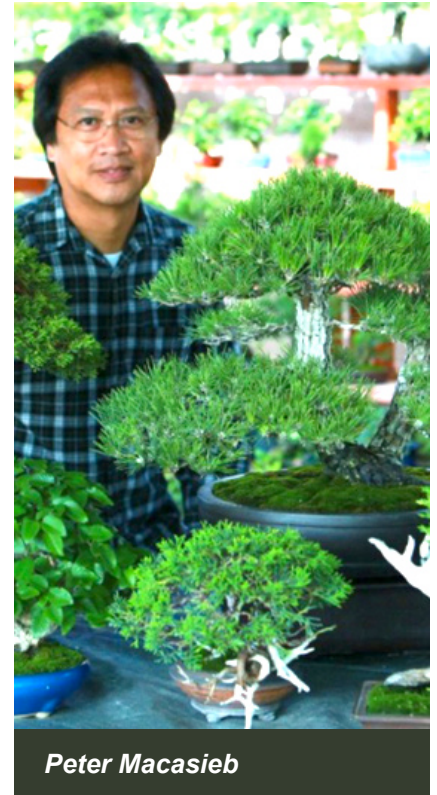
Darryl Elmer, SDBC 1st VP

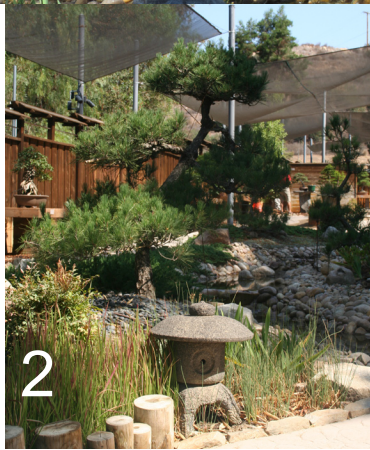
SAFARI PARK

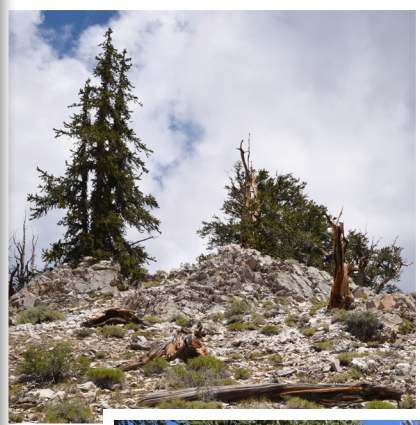


SDBC members who are planning to come to the October 14th Meeting at the

The Bristlecone Pine Forest Trip

#1: One of the really beautiful trees in the Pavilion is in the landscape. **Dennis Wagner** lead a group of members in transplanting this Japanese Black Pine in April of 2017 from its former location at the entrance to the Pavilion.

#2: Despite being transplanted a bit late, the pine did not skip a beat thanks to the detailed care it received during the process, and proper after care.

#3: This plant is an *Acacia xanthophloea* or *Vachelia xanthophloea*, the signature tree for the Safari Park. The mother tree is near the entrance restaurant. There is a second one at the Pavilion adjacent to the entrance boulder, leaning toward the boulder with nice root exposure. The Safari Park Horticulture Staff offered that we might incorporate them into our Pavilion garden. Giraffes love them since they can curl their tongues around the needles and eat the leaves. It is native to southeastern Africa.

#4: The rocks are used to help lower branches because wiring is obviously out of the question. **Sally** trims the tree by hand, very deftly coursing her way around the thorns. Quite happy to report that Sally does not get stuck that often.

Bleaching with Lime-Sulfur
