
Remembering Larry Upp

Mr. Larry Upp's family and friends attended a celebration of life ceremony for him on November 22nd. Below is a club tribute that honored him at the club's 50th anniversary event in 2015.

"Larry started working with bonsai in 1965, with Bill Murphy who was a lifelong friend and fellow principal in San Diego. He says he wouldn't really call it training as he would watch Bill work and be amazed with the things he would do with these little trees. For demos, Bill would pull a juniper out of a 5 gallon pot and proceed to saw the root in half and Larry would laugh as the audience gasped at the boldness of this thin, little man.

After a period, Larry would look to other members of the SDBC to help him improve his understanding and appreciation of this bonsai art. Workshops with Fred Miyahara group, and Kenji Miyata, Charlie Tamm, and Gary Jones have all worked to help Larry enjoy his little trees. Lew Buellor, Evert Jones, Mas Takanashi, and other

members would help Larry before the meeting started. He says he really appreciated all the help he received from these patient members of SDBC.



Larry's favorite bonsai are the Grewias. He has a "raft-style" that has air roots and flowers, sweeps to the side and really looks great! Murphy introduced Larry to Tecate Cypress and he quickly adapted to these upright plants that he could put into forest groupings. He has made "tenuki "or "Phoenix" bonsai with the Tecate, growing the fast growing tree up the backside of a dead trunk.

Larry says he finds all types of trees interesting as that is the way he is. Each tree is unique and he has many different trees and styles; a cascading grape, raft juniper, Ficus forest, Bald Cypress, Tecate forest, and beautiful Bougainvillea. He loves them all as he sits on his patio taking in his trees.

Larry laughs as he remembers the lessons learned from disasters: deciduous trees dropping all their leaves, so he thought it was dead and threw it away. A Tecate forest that he really loved and suddenly, the main tree started to die and the composition was sadly lost. Lessons learned, experience shared, and knowledge earned.

Larry continues to learn and says he is more of a student today at 88 than when he first started. He learns something every time he gets together with bonsai friends. His is a simple enjoyment doing bonsai with friends, on a beautiful San Diego day, with a vodka tonic in hand.

Let's raise a glass to Larry Upp."

wiggle room to have fun and shape their own experience.

Honestly, it's a little scary to care for these magnificent trees. But with my kids "out of the nest," a new responsibility is welcome. It's a joy to work with my fellow volunteers, who already feel like family. Three

hours in the garden goes by in the blink of an eye. Truly, I should be paying the club for permitting me do this work!

The appreciation shown by visitors is another thing that makes the job fun. You know somebody really wants to see the trees when the JFG doors open at the other end of the garden at 10:00, and by 10:02 they are already in the collection, gazing at a favorite tree. Their many questions slow the work down a bit; but stopping to talk bonsai with inquisitive visitors is the best kind of interruption.

This month we focused on junipers. We removed the old bark from the live vein of the California juniper, exposing the cinnamon color, which contrasts beautifully against the deadwood. Next the *Tak Shimazu* shipaku (say that fast 10 times) will get the same treatment, as recenlty recommended by *Mr. Shimazu*. In addition, we thinned and did some wiring and pad maintenance on the California and both shimpakus.

Unrelated to the JFG, I wanted to share a story from

the GSBF Convention in Sacramento last month. The Saturday demonstration co-headliners were *Yasuo Mitsuya*, *Suthin Sukosolvisit*, and *Bjorn Bjorholm*. In front of the stage were six additional demonstrators who had all apprenticed for *Mr. Mitsuya* in Japan: *John Thompson, Gordon Deeg, Boon Manakitivipart, Dennis Makashima, Cheryl Manning*, and *Nancy Shaner*. *Mr. Mitsuya* split his time between working on his own demo tree (a yew) and shuttling among his former apprentices to comment on their work through an interpreter. *Dennis Makashima*'s demo tree was a stout little "buddha" Japanese black pine. As *Dennis* worked, he related that at the end of his apprenticeship in 1982, his oyakata, *Mr. Mitsuya*'s father, gave *Dennis* a bag of black pine seeds. And 36 years later one of those seeds had grown into the buddha demo tree. It was an impactful demonstration and a testament to *Mr. Mitsuya*'s influence on the art of bonsai in California.
