SDBC Education for February

The more we share, the more we learn

The first of the beginner's classes went very well thanks to pro team of 'Lyn Stevenson and the volunteer assistants Dave Woodall, Marty Mann, and John Voss. Also, a big thanks to John Jackson for transporting the trees for me to the meeting. Be sure to bring your trees to the next class to learn branch wiring techniques to further aid in the styling and shaping of the trees. Thanks to the unseasonably warm weather (forecast is more of the same coming soon), the Privets (the remaining ones I have) have already started to sprout so I am assuming yours are doing the same. So, now you will be able to see how well your tree sprouts new growth and where it sprouts new growth. This will greatly aid in the styling and shaping of your tree which you can get plenty of help to determine during the class. Note that the next beginner's class will start in April and will continue in June and July. Details will be available in the next Bonsai Wire.

This Month's workshop will be very innovative. For those of you who are jazzed about making your own bonsai pots - we will have lots of bags of various textures and colors of clay. Folks can buy their bags. Then you proceed to each of our pottery experts for help. Some might want to throw on a wheel, some might want to make slabs or some might want to push into a mold.

You will make pots, we will collect them, and will arrange for them to be fired and brought back next month. All tools and expert advice included at a cost of \$5 each. Nice!!

The intermediate class in March will be working on Japanese Black Pines from Muranaka Bonsai Nursery under the expert eye of Fred Miyahara and the Piney's (those who have been training with Fred). They will be there for any questions you may have. These Black pines are field grown and freshly dug. They are excellent stock with which to begin learning how to bonsai the black pine. The pines will not be

re-potted until next year. You will be doing some needle removal and some work on the soil under the watchful of the Piney's. There is much to learn about growing a black pine that will be strong and vigorous. The cost of the class is \$70 but could be cheaper depending on the final price of the tree. This will include soil, wire and container (training type).

Important Note: Anyone who worked on a Muranaka pine at last year's class should bring their tree to the class in March for re-potting, follow up advice or just for sharing if you have already re-potted. You may bring your own soil mix or the club will provide a suitable mix for you. Remember that for Black pines excellent drainage is essential, especially in the lower portion of the pot to prevent root rot.

Remember to bring a tree or two...or three to the fellowship part of the meeting. You can get excellent help from our many accomplished members with any questions you may have, or just work on your trees for a while or just bring'em to show and share.

A Time to Sit Back and Plan for Spring

Trees may still be idle now but the insect infestation can still do harm. Spray deciduous trees with dormant spray (Ortho Garden Disease Control) (lime sulfur) before any new growth appears. This protects trees from overwintering insects. Occasional applications of an all purpose fungicide, miticide and insecticide minimizes new damage and protect the health of the tree during this period.

Wires should be well exposed on most of the trees since foliage has dropped and new growth is not obstructing a detailed inspection.. Remove all of last year's wires. Severe bark cuts can occur during the slow winter months when the woody portion of the trees tend to lignify and swell. Early spring spurts quickly engulfs old wire and causes damage.

Watering routines must be continued-but curtailed. Most bonsai can be maintained on minimal schedules however don't allow anything to completely dry out. Don't rely on possible light winter rains.

If you apply a solution of lime sulfur to trees at this time to prevent wood rot damage be sure to avoid any newly formed sprouts or buds. Don't allow the chemical run-off to penetrate into the root area. Lime sulfur is generally applied to a wet wood surface. Allow the application to dry before you apply any overhead water that may seep into the root ball.

During this time, in January or February, you can occupy yourself with a program of pot cleanup. All those pots have been sitting around and waiting for repotting activities to begin. They have probably accumulated layers of soil and lime deposits. Scrub them with a strong soapy solution and some bleach. Apply 'lime-off' or vinegar to the white spots (or just some elbow grease and cleanser) and rinse them well. Allow them to dry in the full sun to prevent any infestation carryover. Use one of the good Japanese 'erasers' that work well to remove salt deposits on pots as well as rust and grime on tools.

Make a list of the trees that will require repotting in spring. Place an identifying marker in the pots that require attention. Begin with deciduous or flowering/fruiting trees still in a dormant stage or just beginning to emerge. Follow with pines and junipers. Go easy on any pruning that may be required, particularly on early transplants. Wait until the sap begins to flow before you do any serious pruning or pinching of the new growth. Let the tips harden-off. Heavier pruning may be done later.

Another important activity at this time involve your tools. Now is the time to sort them out. Sharpen all cutting edges, remove accumulations of rust and pitch stains. Dip tools into a bleach solution to purify them. Oil (WD-40)all surfaces for protection. Be ready to go.


